- (3) I agree that a construction should come with a reference back to the problem. I have introduced such references.

There is a conceptual difference between Theorem/Proof pairs and Problem/Construction pairs. In the former case we refer to the theorem because a theorem is a logical proposition and we are interested whether it is true or not. The content of the proof is irrelevant for the further use of the theorem. In the latter case the problem only specifies the type of an object that needs to be constructed. There can be many objects of this type. In the future use we have to refer to the construction which provides a unique description of the object. There can be several, non-equivalent, constructions for the same problem that will have to be referred to in the future.

About the name "construction" versus "solution". I use the word "construction" because it precisely describes the content of what follows. Each problem in the text is formulated as a task to construct exactly one object of the specified type. In general there can be problems of different form and there a more generic word "solution" would be more appropriate.
